During the Service

Please switch off mobile phones. Everyone joins in with the service, following the words in this sheet and saying the words in bold type together. The places where we need to sit, stand or kneel are indicated in the sheet.

All those who are baptised into the Christian church (any denomination) are welcome to receive communion here. If you prefer not to receive, please come forward anyway to be blessed today. You will be directed to the front at the appropriate time by our wardens/stewards.

We prepare for the service with quiet prayer.

The Gathering

We stand to sing our first hymn as the choir and ministers process into the church. Hymn words are in the hymn books, numbers are on the boards in church.

Hymn

We remain standing at the end of the hymn.

The Greeting

The President: Grace, mercy and peace from God our
Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you

And also with you

Words of welcome are given.

Opening Prayer

The President: Holy God, holy and strong,
holy and immortal:
have mercy on us.

**Holy God, holy and strong,
holy and immortal:
have mercy on us.**

Silence is kept

**Eternal God, source of all blessing, help us to worship you
with all our heart and mind and strength;**

**For you alone are God, creator, redeemer and life breath,
for ever and ever. Amen.**

Prayers of Penitence

The Deacon:

The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart God will not despise. Our sins accuse us. We confess them to God.

Silence is kept. We kneel if able to pray.

Wash me thoroughly from my wickedness
and cleanse me from my sin:

We sing: Lord, have mercy upon us,
Lord, have mercy upon us,

Make me a clean heart, O God,
and renew a right spirit within me:

We sing: Christ, have mercy upon us,

Christ, have mercy upon us,

Cast me not away from your presence
and take not your holy spirit from me:

We sing: Lord, have mercy upon us,
Lord, have mercy upon us,
Lord, have mercy upon us.

Silence is kept

Absolution

The President:

May almighty God who sent the Son into the world to save sinners bring you pardon and peace, now and for ever.

Amen.

The Collect

The Collect prayer for the day is said and all respond **Amen.**

We sit for the first reading.

The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

At the end:

Hear the word of the Lord **Thanks be to God**

We stand to sing.

Gradual Hymn

We remain standing at the end of the hymn to hear the Gospel.

Gospel Reading

We remain standing and turn to face the Gospel book.

We sing as led by the minister and/or choir:

Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory .

Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory .

Your word is a lamp to my feet
and a light to my path.

Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to John

***We say:* Glory to you, O Lord**

At the end: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

***We say:* Praise to you, O Christ.**

Sermon

We sit when invited for the sermon.

The Creed

Let us stand and declare our faith in God.

Reader 1: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,
**maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.**

Reader 2: We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
**God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,**

Reader 2: begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father.
Through him all things were made.

Reader 3: For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven, was incarnate from
the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary,
and was made man.

**For our sake he was crucified under Pontius
Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.**

Reader 3: On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
**he ascended into heaven and is seated at the
right hand of the Father. He will come again in
glory to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.**

Reader 1: We believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

Reader 2: With the Father and the Son
he is worshipped and glorified.

Reader 3: He has spoken through the prophets.
**We believe in one holy,
catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism
for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

We kneel if practicable for the Prayers of Intercession.

Prayers of Intercession

We pray to the Lord for courage to give up other things
and to give ourselves to him this Lent.

*We pray for the needs of the Church and the world, for those
who are suffering or in need. This or another response may be
used:*

Lord meet us in the silence,
Give us strength and hear our prayer.

At the end of the prayers

God of all time and space,
in your love and goodness you have taught us
to come close to you in penitence
with prayer, fasting and generosity;
accept the efforts of our hearts and hands this Lent
and when we fall by our weakness
raise us up with your unfailing mercy;
through Jesus Christ your Son. **Amen**

When our prayers end we stand to share God's peace.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace

The President

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God
through our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us grace.

The peace of the Lord be always with you
and also with you.

God's peace may be shared with a wave or a handshake.

The Offertory

During this hymn a collection plate will be passed round and the altar table prepared for communion.

Hymn

We remain standing after the hymn.

Prayer at the Preparation of the table

The Deacon: God of mercy and compassion, your Word calls us home to faith and love. Accept all we offer you this day; in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Eucharistic Prayer

The President sings:

The Lord is here. **His spirit is with us**

Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

The President praises God for his mighty acts.

We join singing:

**Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts,
Heaven and earth are full of thy glory.
Glory be to thee, O Lord most high.
Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

The President recalls the Last Supper.

The Deacon: Praise to you, Lord Jesus

We say: **Dying you destroyed our death,
rising you restored our life:
Lord Jesus, come in glory.**

***The prayer continues and at the end we all respond boldly
Amen.***

We sit or kneel if practicable. Silence is kept.

The Lord's Prayer

Lord Jesus remember us in your kingdom and teach us to
pray: **Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come, your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.**

**Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.**

Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

**For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now
and for ever. Amen.**

Breaking of the Bread

Every time share in bread and wine
we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Agnus Dei

We sing:

**O Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world:
have mercy upon us.**

**O Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world:
have mercy upon us.**

**O Lamb of God that takest away the sins of the world:
grant us peace.**

Invitation to Communion

The Deacon Let us pray now with those at home
joining in this spiritual communion,
remembering that God creates family here on earth
when we share in Christ's heavenly feast.

**Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your disciples, 'I am with
you always'. Be with us today, as we share this spiritual
communion. We offer ourselves to you.**

**Hear our prayers for others and for ourselves,
and keep us in your care. Amen.**

The President: Jesus is the Lamb of God
who takes away the sin of the world.
Blessed are those who are called to his supper.
**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word, and I shall be healed.**

When we consume our bread and wine.
The body and blood of Christ. **Amen.**

***Please come forward as directed by our stewards to receive
either the bread/wine or a blessing. If you are not accustomed to
taking communion and would prefer to receive a blessing please
cross your arms when you come to the front. Gluten free bread
and bread without wine are available, please ask the person
distributing communion.***

***During this time we pray quietly, sing our communion hymn and
listen to our choir as those around us also receive.***

Communion Hymn

An anthem may also be sung.

Prayer after Communion

The President prays the post-communion prayer for each week of Lent and we join in with Amen.

God of our pilgrimage,
you have fed us with the bread of heaven.
Refresh and sustain us
as we go forward on our journey,
in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Community notices may be shared by the clergy, wardens or others. We may hear back from our young people.

We stand to sing

Hymn

During the hymn the ministers and choir process to the west end of the church. The final part of the service will be led from there, and we all face the back of the church at the end of the hymn.

The Sending Out

Responsory

The Deacon: This is love, not that we loved God,
but that he loved us and sent his Son.

He is the sacrifice for our sins,
that we might live through him.

If God loves us so much
we ought to love one another.

If we love one another **God lives in us.**


Blessing & Dismissal
